

This biennium collegians, alumnae, chapter, region and national volunteers attended Alpha Sigma Alpha programs that received funding from the Foundation. Due to the pandemic, some programs moved from an in-person format to a virtual iteration. The Academy was replaced with the Virtual Keynote Series and The 2020 National Convention Reimagined offered a way to gather for programming online. Diane Yencic James General Leadership Fund and Dolly Loyd Education and Leadership Fund provided grant money for the Emma Coleman Frost Leadership Development Institute 2019 and The 2020 National Convention Reimagined. The Anita Reichling Alumnae Development Fund provided funding for Behind Happy Faces advisor and volunteer curriculum.



Number of members in attendance



Behind Happy Faces Mental Health Education

Since fall 2020, Alpha Sigma Alpha provides collegiate members and volunteers education on the most prevalent mental health issues students face through the Behind Happy Faces curriculum. The program includes online lessons to help members better understand mental health and address mental health experiences within their chapter. The curriculum allows members to better understand the mental health spectrum, learn coping skills and how to approach sisters who might need help.

The Alpha Sigma Alpha Foundation is proud to fully fund Behind Happy Faces for both volunteer and collegiate use with assistance from the Anita Reichling Alumnae Development Fund. Mental health education benefits members well beyond their Sorority experiences, particularly as they navigate life during the pandemic.

"After going through Behind Happy Faces, I realized a lot about not only mental health, but my sorority sisters as well. Being a senior psychology major, I have spent a lot of my college career learning about different mental illnesses, mental health related topics and how to take care of our mental health. While learning about these topics, however, I've realized that an education shows you the textbook version of mental health. Behind Happy Faces gave me an opportunity to see those real-life examples of how individuals handle their own mental health, whether that be positively or something they struggle with.

What I enjoyed the most about this program was the opportunity to speak anonymously about something we wish our sisters knew about us in relation to mental health. This activity allowed not only myself, but my sisters as well, to realize that we are not alone in our struggles no matter how much it may feel like that sometimes. We all have a mental health that needs to be taken care of with the kindest hands, and knowing that others are going through the same things we may be dealing with allows the walls that we build up to be knocked down, even if only by one brick at a time."
